Prepare now to participate in the Mennonite Relief Sale Fellowship Meals which are planned for Sundays, February 26 and March 4. These fellowship meals are to raise money for the upcoming Relief Sale on April 13 and 14. The Fellowship Meal brochures will be available soon.

The Kansas Mennonite Relief Sale is scheduled April 13 & 14, 2012 at the Kansas State Fairgrounds in Hutchinson. The Relief Sale's sole purpose is to raise funds for the Mennonite Central Committee—a world relief organization (www.mcc.org). The sale annually generates between \$250,000 to over \$400,000. It takes a whole host of individuals playing their part in order that we might carry out the Lord's bidding to care for the "least of these" found in Matt. 25. In the few short months leading up to the Relief Sale, we call upon our supporting churches to donate toward the sale budget so that every dollar raised at the sale can go to MCC. We call upon quilters to complete their quilts and to gather extra supplies to donate to Quilters' Corner. We call upon individuals to donate items to the General Auction, Silent Auction and even our Kid's Auction. During the cool winter months, house plants can be divided and vegetable plants started to sell at Plants and Things and tea towel sets completed for Kansas Crafts. Each year, people make the pledge to work out more. Challenge yourself to participate in the Run for Relief, a 5K run/walk the Saturday of the sale and spend the winter months gathering your pledges.
